THE DAY IN THE CHURCH YEAR....ALL SAINTS DAY ABOUT THE SCRIPTURE READINGS.....

Of all three years of the lectionary cycle, this year's All Saints readings have the most tears. Isaiah and Revelation look forward to the day when God will wipe away all tears; in John's gospel, Jesus weeps along with Mary and all the gathered mourners before he demonstrates his power over death. On All Saints Day we celebrate the victory won for all the faithful dead, but we grieve for our beloved dead as well,

knowing that God honors our tears. We bring our grief to the table and find there a foretaste of Isaiah's feast to come.

ISAIAH 25:6-9: Isaiah sees a vision of the end of days, when the Lord will gather all God's people on God's holy mountain and will prepare for them a rich feast. At this banquet the Lord will wipe the tears from all eyes. And there will be no more sorrow, for God will destroy death itself.

REVELATION 21:1-6A Here is a vision of the new heaven and new earth in which God resides fully with God's people so that mourning, despair, and pain have been eradicated. These renewing words from the God who spans all of time are trustworthy and true.

JOHN 11:32-44: Through the raising of Lazarus, Jesus offers the world a vision of the life to come, when death and weeping will be no more.

Isaiah 25:6-9 - 1st Lesson

⁶ On this mountain the LORD of hosts will make for all peoples

a feast of rich food, a feast of well-matured wines,

of rich food filled with marrow, of well-matured wines strained clear.

- And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations;
